## ACCLAIMED AUTHOR AND JOURNALIST ANDRÉE AELION BROOKS PRESENTS A BRIDGE ACROSS TIME: JEWISH DESCENDENTS EXPLORE THEIR ANCESTRAL VILLAGE IN SPAIN

Marlboro, NY. July 11, 2014. . . Exploring family history and genealogy has become a great American pastime. Andrée Aelion Brooks, one of our regular lecturers and a Gomez Foundation for Mill House trustee, talks about a history-infused reunion she attended in Spain, April, 2014.

At the next Sunday at Mill House program on July 20, 2014, Brooks will share the reunion experience of descendents, like herself, of a Jewish family from the medieval village of Ayllon, located northeast of Madrid. They arrived, strangers all, from twelve countries to recount, recall and explore. What happened? What did they learn?

The presentation at 11 am follows a bagel breakfast from 10 am to 11 am. A special free tour of the Mill House will be offered to attendees at 12:15, following the presentation.

Sunday at the Mill House is an ongoing program of lectures and presentations on subjects related to the history of the Gomez Mill House.
